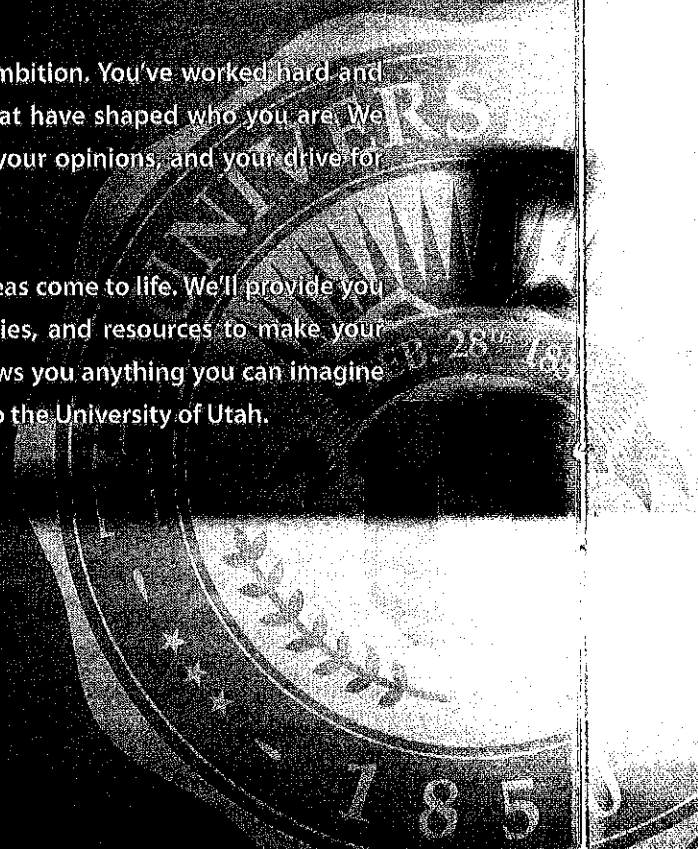

Application is reviewed individually and consideration is given based on, but not limited to:

- Rigorous course selection throughout high school career (including AP, IB, Dual Enrollment and Honors courses)
- Academic trend
- Standardized test scores (ACT and/or SAT)
- Successful completion of High School Core Course Requirements
- Academic achievement and awards/distinctions
- Commitment to community engagement, citizenship, and leadership
- Personal qualities: integrity, maturity, motivation, and resilience
- Involvement in student clubs and organizations, athletics, or other extracurricular activities
- Special circumstances: military or other special responsibilities
- Unusual or extraordinary circumstances

The \$45 application fee is non-refundable. An additional \$30 will be added to late applications. See admissions.utah.edu/deadlines for details.

Submit ACT (or SAT) Scores

ACT and SAT scores must be sent electronically by the testing agency. Request your scores using test code 4274 for the ACT, and 4853 for the SAT.

Submit Transcripts

Official high school and/or university transcripts must be sent to the Office of Admissions directly from all schools a student attends. We also accept electronic transcripts from SENDedu, Docufide by Parchment, National Student Clearinghouse, AVOW, Credential Solutions Transcripts Network, and Scrip-Safe.

Once everything has been submitted, track your application at admissions.utah.edu/status. Official admissions decisions will be mailed.

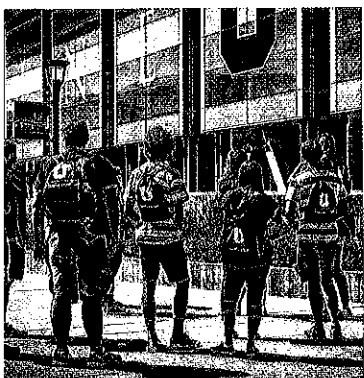

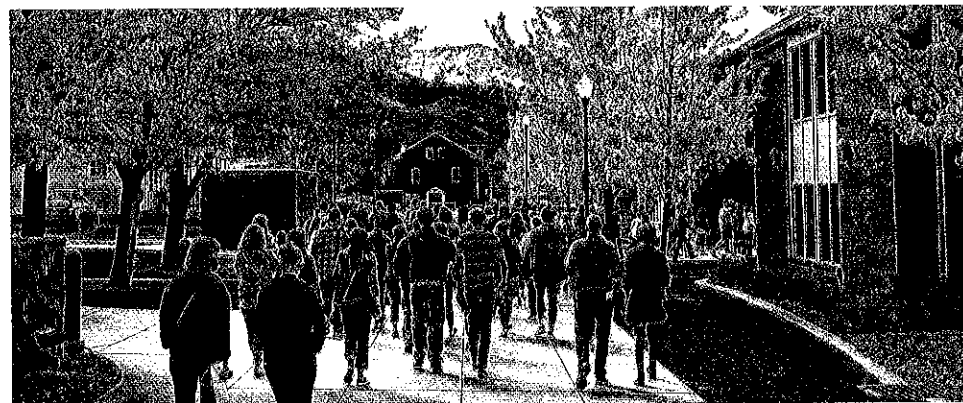

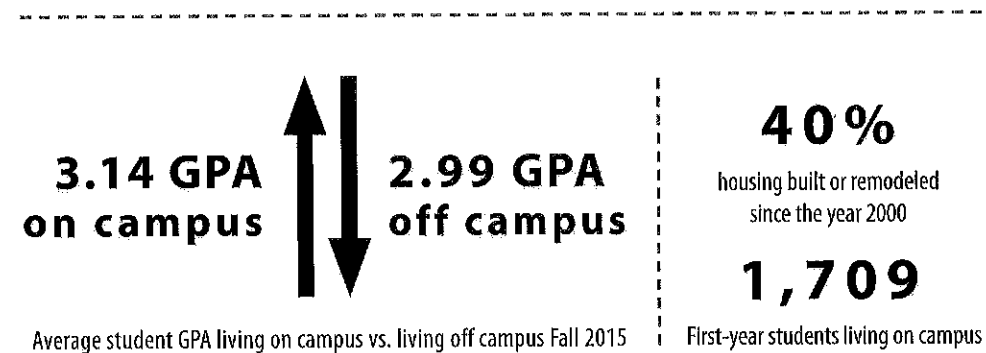
